

ABU ROAD

Abu Road C.D. Block and tehsil of the same name lies in the southern part of Sirohi district. The Block is located at a distance of 72 kms. from district headquarters (Sirohi). There are 81 villages in the block with the total population of 114,818 persons. Area of the C.D. Block is 860.87 sq. km It is bounded by tehsils Sirohi and Pindwara from northern side, tehsil Reodar from western side, the southern and eastern sides have common boundary with Gujarat state along with district Udaipur on east.
